NEW HARTFORD – Mr. Mark D. Tubert, age 73, peacefully went home to his loving Lord on Monday, May 19, 2025.

Born in Worcester, MA on April 6, 1952, Mark was the son of the late John W. and R. Martha (French) Tubert. He was raised and educated local to Worcester. In his devotion to his Lord and to furthering his education, he later relocated to New York and graduated from Pinecrest Bible Training Center in Salisbury Center.

It was on March 30, 1985, that Mark wed the former Marialana “Maria” Canarelli—a beautiful union that would last 40 years. The pair were a great team and complemented each other well, always putting the needs of the other before themselves. They did everything together, from raising their beloved son, Benjamin, to coaching the Yankees from the couch. They always filled one another with love and were sure to instill that same love in their only child, and later, their four beautiful grandchildren, of whom were their greatest joys in life. Maria will miss the smiles and laughter that only her darling Mark could bring to her face. The couple was an aspiration for what a marriage built on trust looks like.

Mark began his career as a waiter at Villa Rosa. He later discovered a passion for truck driving, first working for Klein’s All Sports and then for Steel Treaters

Inc., where he remained for over 20 years before retiring. He was a hardworking, dedicated man who would do whatever it took to support his family. His favorite “job” was when he embraced his role as fulltime grandpa. He enjoyed his retirement with a grandchild in one arm and pushing his Billy Goat leaf blower with the other. Above all, he was a family man, who considered raising his son as his highest accomplishment and loved his grandchildren more than life itself.

A man with a big heart, Mark was quick-witted and had a great sense of humor, never failing to make those around him laugh with a good one-liner. He had a deep concern for the less fortunate and the downtrodden, and for a time he spoke monthly on Sunday nights at the Rescue Mission. He served alongside Maria as Central New York representatives for Bible Time Ministries International, where they assisted in ministering to ministers through local gatherings.

If Mark ever found himself with a spare moment, he enjoyed taking long walks, golfing, and cruising around in his famous red convertible. He also relished his weekly Saturday breakfasts at Marr-Logg’s with his good friend Ronald Lowell. His family will never forget the times they spent together at Hampton Beach and the many yearly occasions they gathered for—rarely doing anything apart from one another.

For many years, Mark was a devoted member at New Testament Church in Rome, but more recently, he attended Redeemer Church in Utica. A true believer in God, he prayed daily and was never afraid to share his faith—whether with a close friend or a complete stranger.

Mark is survived by his precious Maria; son and daughter-in-law, Benjamin Michael, Sr. and Dominique Tubert; grandchildren who absolutely adored him, Benjamin Michael Tubert, Jr., James Emmanuel Tubert, Talia Terese Tubert,

and Mark John Tubert; and siblings and their spouses, Jody Tubert, Marcia and John Mulcahy, Lisa McDonald (the late Peter McDonald), Tracy Tubert, and Robert “Buzza” Tubert. Mark held close to his heart the memory of his late brother, John “Jack” Jr. He is further survived by his sister-in-law, Maureen “Mo” Tubert; many nieces, nephews, and cousins; in-laws, Jane Canarelli (the late Frank R. Canarelli, Sr.), Pat and Rachel Canarelli, and David and Diane Canarelli; and a host of many dear friends.
