DEERFIELD - Mrs. Mary Ellen (Williams) LaGray, age 83, went home to the Lord on Sunday, October 4, 2020 when she peacefully passed away with her loved ones by her side.

Born in Utica on October 19, 1936, Mary Ellen was the daughter of the late David and Mary (Mulvihill) Williams. She was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School Class of 1955. She was a member of the Altar Rosary Society, Wednesday Night Rosary Group, served on the Parish Council, was a Eucharistic Minister, a Religious education Instructor for the communion classes, a member of the Catholic Daughters, volunteered at The

Good News Foundation and a volunteer at all bazaars and church functions. It was often said that if there was a church activity, she was there. She also was an avid volunteer at The Stanley Theatre, The Hope House, the annual Heart Run/Walk and volunteered as a tutor at General Herkimer Elementary School. She was also a savvy shopper, and held the “shop-till-you-drop” mindset, especially with her granddaughters Heather and Megan who will hold those sprees in their memories. It was a bond not to be forgotten. Thursdays were her weekly hairdresser appointment with her beloved hairdresser and dear friend Marianne, followed by an afternoon at the Deerfield Senior Center where she and her husband had a special closeness with Lura and Dorothy. Recently, her grandson Gregory and fiancé Amanda moved in with her to assist in her daily needs, a true blessing for which she was grateful.
