Mary had a calm demeanor but she also had rules and guidelines when raising her children. Although much of her time was allotted to her work ethic, she found time enough for her family because they came first. Mary lived her life by going the extra mile. And when she became a grandmother, she loved her grandchildren as her own, especially when they were babies. She claimed she didn't enjoy cooking, but her family agreed that she pleased their palates with the savory food she prepared for them.

For Mary, the Bible was the word of God's wisdom and encouragement, and it gave true meaning to her faith. Whenever she read scripture or verse, it brought her peace, hope, and comfort during difficult days. She stood strong in her beliefs and trusted in her Lord. She was a parishioner of St. Paul's Baptist Church.

Mary is survived by her husband, Edward; and her son, Edward Noble II. She was preceded by her daughter, Mary Linda Adams-Williams in 2001. 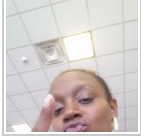
