



Mary D. (Pape) Palmieri

June 16, 1917 - February 8, 2010

Mrs. Mary D. (Pape) Palmieri, age 92, of Utica, passed away on Monday, February 8, 2010 at the Masonic Care Community of NY with the love and support of her family.

Born in Rome, NY on June 16, 1917, Mary was the daughter of the late Joseph and Laretta (Clemente) Pape. She was raised and educated locally. On May 27, 1950 she was joined in marriage to Rocco F. "BaPa" Palmieri, Sr. with whom she shared 38 loving years prior to his passing on August 7, 1988. Mary's profession as a bookkeeper yielded her various positions, most notably with the Oneida County Department of Social Services, from which she retired in 1979. A loving, family-oriented woman, Mary was appreciative of life's blessings, especially her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and all their spouses. She was a good-hearted soul, active in local charitable organizations and donating her hand crocheted mittens to anyone in need. She was an avid NY Yankees fan, and in her younger years enjoyed bowling. She was a communicant of St. Mark's Church in N. Utica, and at one time, a member of the choir and Altar Rosary Society at St. Mark's.
