



## Mary Rose (Luggerio) DelMastro

April 8, 1914 - January 14, 2009

Mrs. Mary Rose (Luggerio) DelMastro, age 94, a longtime Utica resident and recently of Alexandria, Virginia, passed away after a brief illness on Wednesday, January 14, 2009 at the Leewood Healthcare Center in Virginia. Born in Utica on April 8, 1914, Mary was the daughter of the late Joseph and Giovanna (Spiridigliozi) Luggerio. She was raised and educated locally and attended St. Mary of Mt. Carmel School.
