CLINTON - Mr. Milton J. "Jim" Gau, age 74, passed away on Sunday, December 23, 2018 at MVHS at St. Luke's Healthcare with his loving family by his side.

Born in Utica on March 7, 1944, Milton was the son of the late Milton and Dorothy (Lutz) Gau. Raised and educated in New Hartford, he was a graduate of New Hartford High School/Class of 1962. On June 27, 1964 he married the former Rosalie Lazzaro with whom she shared 54 years. Their love and common interests made their marriage a success, and the blessing of children meant the world to him.

Jim worked as a Route Salesman for Pepsi-Cola and he was fondly known as "Mr. Pepsi" or simply, #1. His affable, amenable personality was conducive to his line of work. As a dad, he was a good

listener and a confidant, offering his advice and guidance. His kids have fond remembrances of dad attending their sporting events, particularly when he showed up in the “Pepsi truck” for just a moment, these memories continue to warm their hearts. His granddaughter was his sunshine, and he loved her with all his heart.

Jim and Roe’s house was home base for Thanksgiving. He was always willing to help in preparing for this great occasion. They spent endless efforts making pies and no one left the house without one in hand! Jim had a penchant for golfing with the Pepsi guys at area greens and playing with the Wednesday morning league at Westmoreland, as well as watching golf on television. He enjoyed the drama of Law & Order, and as a news buff, he always read the daily newspaper. He appreciated vintage cars and attended local car shows. Although he was a down-to-earth, old-school country music listener, he threw in an occasional polka.

At the end of the day, Jim was an honest, humble man who knew that his greatest gift was having a family who respected and loved him. He was blessed in this life, and he believed in the Lord.
