



Mrs. Nancy M. (Cocomazzi) Indolfi

Mrs. Nancy M. “Nunziata” (Cocomazzi) Indolfi, age 83, went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, November 4, 2015 as she passed away at the Presbyterian Home for Central NY with her family by her side.

Born in Utica on May 5, 1932, Nancy was the daughter of the late Michael and Antoinette (Melchianda) Cocomazzi. She was raised and educated locally.

Nancy’s work career included positions as an assembler at the General Electric Company on Broad Street, as well as a teller for the Oneida National Bank. Lastly, she worked at the ConMed Corporation as an assembler until an illness curtailed her career. Honest and hard-working, Nancy was truly one-of-a-kind. She was quick-witted, humorous, independent, and strong.

Throughout her life, she was determined to succeed and guide those around her to do the same. She was a mother who loved her children more than life itself and unconditionally. She was a courageous woman with an incredible intuitive nature. She always knew how to successfully manage a situation “her way”. Her home was always open, allowing those in need to live as family, making sure they were safe and cared for. Nancy loved spending time with her loved ones, sharing conversation and a cup of coffee. She was also a soccer-grandma. In her younger years, she enjoyed bowling in weekly leagues, an activity she continued at the Presbyterian Home. She loved animals and had many pets, especially remembering Brandy. One of her greatest ventures was having purchased a house on West Street where her family knew “a home of their own” during their childhood. Nancy was

grounded in her Catholic faith and attended Mass with deep devotion. Nancy's passing was a pathway to be closer to her daughter, Debra Jean McCloud, who passed away on September 23, 2015. Nancy is survived by her children and their loved ones, Mark and Deb Indolfi of Floyd NY, Sherry A. (Indolfi) and Paul Hough of CA, and Frank M. "Bud" and Sharon Indolfi of Utica; her son-in-law, Daniel McCloud of CA; her grandchildren, Nathan and Sarah McCloud; Christopher, David and Val, and Brian and Joelene Indolfi; Nicole Hough; and Alexandra, and Jenna Indolfi; and her great-grandchildren, April, Tyler, and Zachary McCloud; Jacksen Indolfi; Blake Hough; and Stella Indolfi.
