September 11, 1953 - March 7, 2024

UTICA - Patrick Mario Ciccone, aged 70, passed away unexpectedly in the comfort and dignity of his home on Thursday, March 7, 2024.

Born in Utica on September 11, 1953, Patrick was the son of the late Merino J., Sr., and Marie (DiMatteo) Ciccone, marking the beginning of a life filled with dedication, passion, and love for his community.

Patrick was a proud graduate of T.R. Proctor High School, where he formed the foundational relationships and values he would carry throughout his life. His professional career was highlighted by 30 years of dedicated service as an operator at the Oneida County Water Treatment Plant before his well-earned retirement.

Patrick was known for his vivacious nature and big, loving heart. He was respectful in greeting others, always offering a kind handshake or a loving embrace. His love for social interaction was evident in his eagerness to discuss various topics of the world and his opinions on them.

An avid collector of war memorabilia, Patrick's passion for history was only matched by his love for animals. Dubbed the "St. Francis" of his neighborhood, he looked after all the dogs and cats that lived there, ensuring they were taken care of. His daily visits with Charlie at the Dari-Del were a

testament to his love for his neighborhood and those who resided there, always looking out for their needs.

Patrick is survived by his twin sister, Patricia "Patty" Ciccone and Ellen Olson; brothers and sisters-in-law, Merino, Jr. and Alberta Ciccone, Joseph A. and MaryAnn Ciccone, and Thomas W. Ciccone. He will also be fondly remembered by his nieces and nephews, Merino J. Ciccone II, Albert "AJ" Ciccone, Sheryl Brady, the late Joseph Ciccone (2019), and Merino J. Ciccone III; and several great-nieces, great-nephews, and cousins. He will also be remembered by his friends, Sal LaScala, Rich Archer, and Tony DeIDuca.
