



Rose M. (Adamany) Dote

February 1, 1917 - November 3, 2014

Mrs. Rose M. (Adamany) Dote, age 97, passed away on Monday, November 3, 2014, at the Masonic Care Community of NY with her loving family by her side.

Born in New York Mills on February 1, 1917, Rose was the daughter of the late Aid and Moubarak "Anna" (Hamjy) Adamany. Raised and educated locally, she was a graduate of Utica Free Academy, an accomplishment which instilled much pride in her during this era. At one time, she was married to John J. Dote who passed away in 1993.

Rose held many positions during her working career from her job with Wolf News to employment at the Oneita Knitting Mill. She left the workplace to care for her children when they were young. As her family matured, she re-entered the working world at Smith Laundry & Dry Cleaning and later at the Ducks Back Hunting Clothing Company, the position from which she retired. Rose was a hard worker and a woman for all seasons. She was a diligent caretaker whose aim was to please. She knew each of her children and loved them unconditionally. In turn, although fiercely independent, they reciprocated with much respect and complied with her wishes. She was who she was because of the pride she held for her Lebanese roots. Rose lived a simple life that was rich in family, love, and laughter. It was a traditional lifestyle, but she was ahead of her time in awareness and wisdom. During her spare time, she enjoyed sewing, often creating her own clothing. She was also skilled in crocheting and knitting, sharing her handmade articles as gifts to her loved

ones. In her spare time she enjoyed doing Cryptograms. She was a member of the 49ers. Rose was indebted to her Lord and lived a good Christian life. She often asked her Lord for guidance and courage to embrace her obstacles. She was a parishioner of St. Louis Gonzaga Church and a member of the St. Mary's Guild.

Rose is survived by her daughter, Yvonne Flihan and companion Daniel Stone, of Utica. She held close to her heart the memory of her daughter, Kathleen "Kathy" Migliaccio, who passed away on July 18, 2012. She will also be cherished by her son, John Dote of Utica; her grandchildren, Deborah McAffrey, Joseph J. and Laura Flihan, Kathy Ann and Walter McRae, Richard Migliaccio, Renee Migliaccio and Mike Martin, John and Maria Dote, Jr., and Savannah R.
