



Mr. Stanley J. Nobles

March 22, 1923 - September 16, 2011

Mr. Stanley J. "Stan" Nobles, age 88, of Utica, passed away on Friday, September 16, 2011 at the Charles T. Sitrin Health Care Center with his loving family by his side.

Stanley was born in Perronville, Michigan on March 22, 1923, the son of the late Joseph and Maria (Dudek) Winiarski. At an early age, he moved with his family to upstate New York settling in Whitesboro. He was raised and educated locally, and continued his studies by enrolling in college courses. On August 14, 1965 he married the former Rose T. Angelicchio. A respectful and good man, his role as an outstanding husband and father was guided by his faith, and his devotion and concern for his family's well-being was a cornerstone of his love. Although a quiet man, Stan's humble side was balanced by a clever sense of dry humor.

A hard working, industrious man, Stan began his working life at Remington Arms in Ilion. In the late 1950's he held an office position at the Griffiss Air Force Base in the Rome Air Material Area (ROAMA) which was the department responsible for managing Air Force communications programs. His last place of employment was with the Utica Board of Water Supply where he began as a meter reader, advanced to Billing Supervisor, and retired as an Assistant Foreman in 1985 after 27 years of loyal service. He was a fan of basketball and served as an official and referee on weekends. As a member of the International Association of Approved Basketball Officials (IAABO) Board #51, he received an award in 1979 for his dedication, devotion, and

service to the game. He was a parishioner of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel/Blessed Sacrament Parish and an altar server for 8 years. He also was a member of the Mt. Carmel Society and other parish organizations.

Stan is survived by his loving wife, Rose; and his daughter, Lori Ann Nobles and her special friend Joe Rella, both of Utica. In addition, he leaves several sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces, nephews, cousins, and many valued friendships. He was predeceased by his sister, Sophia Nobles; his brothers, Carl Nobles, and John Nobles; and several in-laws.
