



## Mr. Steven A. "Mooney" Ermacor

June 20, 1956 - July 23, 2015

Mr. Steven A. "Mooney" Ermacor, age 59, passed away unexpectedly on Thursday, July 23, 2015 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center with his loving wife, sons, and family by his side.

Born in Utica on June 20, 1956, Steven was the son of the late Frank J., Jr. and Lucy (Gatto) Ermacor. Raised and educated locally, he was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School/Class of 1974. On June 27, 1981 he wed the former Ann Ceci with whom he shared 34 years in a marriage that was founded upon love, respect, and traditional values.

A dedicated and hardworking man, Steven enjoyed a 35-year career at Buck Property Management, Inc. where he devoted himself to the duties and details of his job in the capacity of Superintendent. Honesty was Mooney's hallmark, a virtue that was evident in all aspects of his life. He honorably lived up to his responsibilities in all his relationships, and he went above and beyond when it came to raising his family. He supported his sons at all their sporting events and treasured family trips and travel, especially their memorable vacation at Disney World. His sons marveled at the job he did, and they strived to make their father proud of them. Mooney had a great smile and a memorable laugh, reflections of the serenity in his soul and the happiness in his heart. He also had a passion for music and a preference for all genres of 1970's tunes. He was always singing the lyrics and moving to beats of his favorite songs. He was a beagle-man, and his canines "Jeter" and "Roxy" were often by his side. He had an array of activities that he was passionate about; you could find him

hunting, fishing, following the events of horse racing, the excitement of games of chance especially at Atlantic City Casinos. He played baseball in his youth and followed the NY Yankees. The indoor sport of bowling brought him striking success — he rolled three 300-games at the Pin-O-Rama Lanes during his weekly Wednesday night leagues. To round out his range of talents, he was a great cook and baker using many recipes from his late Mom and he honored the traditions of holidays and Sunday dinner at his in-laws.

Steven is survived by his wife, Ann; his sons, Steven M. Ermacor and Kelly Goff, David A. Ermacor, and Ryan J. Ermacor and Savanna Crane; and his mother-in-law Jean Ceci of Rome. He held in his heart the wonderful memory of his sister Francine Majka who preceded him in 2005; he also remained close to his brother-in-law Richard Majka which kept Francine so alive in both of their lives. He also leaves many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins, his aunt Gussie Brindisi, and in-laws, Mary Little, Vincent Ceci and Linda Schroettinger, and Joseph and Andrea Ceci. He was also blessed with many great friends during his life. He was predeceased by his special aunt, Josie Gatto; and his father-in-law Vincent Ceci.

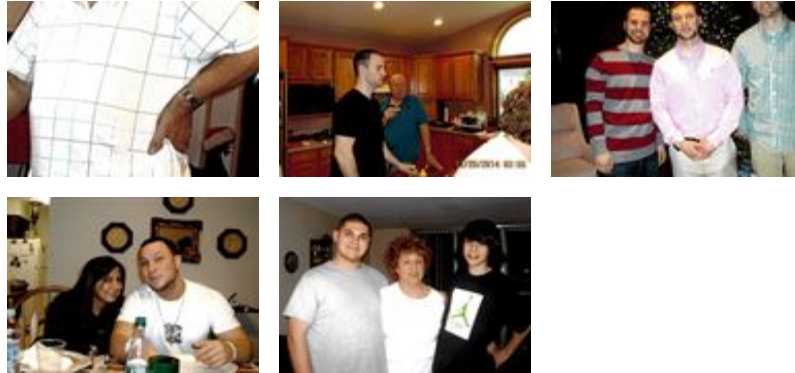
