



## Theresa (Guidi) Pinto

March 12, 1912 - January 30, 2006

Mrs. Theresa (Guidi) Pinto, age 93, of New Hartford, passed away on Sunday, January 29, 2006, in the comfort of her home with her loving family by her side. Born in Canajoharie, NY on March 12, 1912, Theresa was the daughter of the late Augustino and Faustina (Fiore) Guidi. When she was a child, her family moved to Herkimer, NY where she was raised and educated. It was there on October 12, 1940 that she married John R. Pinto. Theresa and John shared a mutually devoted union of 45 years prior to his passing on January 19, 1986. At one time Mrs. Pinto held a position as a nurse's aide at the Masonic Home. In her leisure time, Theresa enjoyed the simple things in life, such as sitting in the comfort of her own living room, carrying on

the ritual of Saturday morning pancakes and syrup, delighting in the pleasure of sharing wine-and-cheese, or appreciating all kinds of music, especially the Big Band Sound which brought her wonderful memories of bygone days. Like her favorite saint, Theresa loved animals, especially her grandchildren's dogs, Chico and Sidney, whom she thought was "smarter than most people." Mrs. Pinto is survived by her daughter, who was always a special blessing in her life, and her son-in-law, Carol and Ernest Slocum of New Hartford; her beloved grandchildren, who affectionately knew her as "Gigi," John Sr. and Kathy Fava of Whitesboro, and Teresa (Fava) and Francis X. Schram, with whom she shared a home; and her cherished great-grandson, John Richard Fava, Jr. She is also survived by two sisters and a brother-in-law, Jane and LeRoy Michel of Utica, and Carrie Mackin of Rochester; her nephews and nieces, especially Beth Williamson who provided her aunt with her professional help and personal love; her great-nephews, great-nieces; and her in-laws, including Eleanor Guidi. She was predeceased by three brothers, James, Floyd, and Albert Guidi; and two sisters, Antoinette and Jean, and several in-laws.
