Mr. Todd D. Gordon, age 42, of Whitesboro, NY, passed away unexpectedly on Wednesday, September 6, 2006, at the Oneida Health Care Center with his family by his side.

Born in Philadelphia, PA on June 9, 1964, Todd is the son of Marjorie (Jubis) Gordon and the late William Gordon. He was raised and educated in Utica and was a graduate of John F. Kennedy High School. Todd continued his education at M.V.C.C., and earned a Technical Certificate for Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning. This enabled Todd and his siblings to continue the legacy of the family business, Gordon's HVAC, Inc., founded by his father. On September 16, 1995, he married the former Michele G. Boris. The couple shared a charmed life, truly supportive of each others needs. He always carried an obvious spark in his eye for his true love, Michele.

Being musically inclined, everyone enjoyed his talents as a drummer. He was a benevolent family man, with a smiling sense of humor. His family and work were his priorities, and he loved to spend time with his children. As a loving father, he was their best friend. Affectionately known to his family as "T", he is survived by his loving wife, Michele; his beloved children, Alexis "Lovey" Gordon, and William "Dolly" Gordon; and his mother, Marjorie Gordon. Also surviving are his siblings and

their spouses, Donna and John Sabis, Lance and Debbie Gordon, Barbara and Brian Kolek, and Tracy and Paul Rosati; many nieces and nephews; numerous cousins; and several aunts and uncles. He leaves his father-in-law and mother-in-law, Stanley and Mary Jean Boris; and in-laws, Michael Boris, Anthony and Judi Boris, and David and Tammy Boris.
