



Trinita Louise (Coreelli) Borgia

Mrs. Trinita Louise (Coreelli) Borgia, age 90, of Utica, passed away on Thursday, March 24, 2011 at the Masonic Care Community of NY where she was currently residing. Her passing occurred with the love and support of her family by her side.

Born in Hinckley, NY on May 29, 1920, Trinita was the daughter of the late Antonio and Maria (Civita) Corelli. As a young girl she and her family relocated to the Utica area. On January 11, 1942 she married Thomas Borgia who passed away on December 11, 1969; the happiness of their relationship was based on reciprocal love and a concern for family life.
