UTICA - We mourn the loss and celebrate the long life of our uncle and friend, Victor "Vic" DeCondo, who passed away in the comfort of his life-long home on July 5, 2025, with his family by his side.

Vic was born in Utica, New York to Giuseppe and Vincenza (Zinicola) D'Acunto on May 16, 1932. In 1946 the family surname was changed to DeCondo.

Vic was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School. He was proud to be a certified electrician who worked on many sites throughout New York State. There is hardly a local school, building or business where Vic's professional craftsmanship can't be found. He retired in 1995 after 37 years of service. He was a member of the Utica Lodge No. 0047 and IBEW Local 43.

Vic was a deeply religious man who took great solace in reading and contemplating the Holy Bible. Praying the rosary was an integral part of his day. He was a man who truly lived his religion.

He enjoyed hunting and fishing in the Adirondacks and was known to say: "I always brought two compasses with me, a cheap one and an expensive one. This way I knew when the cheap one was lying." An avid sportsman, he played baseball and ran track in his youth, and he could be found on the racquetball court even in his mid-80s. He was a loyal fan of the New York

Giants football team and the New York Yankees baseball team. He loved quoting Yogi Berra.

Vic was fond of telling stories and characteristically known for not being able to get through a punch line without laughing. Family was a very important part of Vic's life. He was a devoted brother, uncle and great uncle and he was an integral and important presence at family functions. Every Thanksgiving, Vic loved to walk in with his favorite Thanksgiving greeting, "Happy Bird Day everyone!" Not one to ever throw anything out, family members who are old enough, still talk about a rusty, old pick-up truck that Vic clung to like a loyal dog. Even though Vic lived by himself, he was comforted and surrounded by family through the many cards and photos that adorned his kitchen walls.
