



Virginia M. (Zajac) Arcuri

September 2, 1930 - March 26, 2006

Mrs. Virginia M. (Zajac) Arcuri, age 75, of Utica, passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, March 26, 2006 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center. Her sons were by her side at the time of her passing.

Born in Utica on September 2, 1930, Virginia was the daughter of the late John and Caroline Zajac. Raised and educated locally, she was a graduate of Utica Free Academy. On October 13, 1951 she married Joseph F. Arcuri with whom she shared a union of 40 years, one that was filled with their mutual love and devotion. Joseph passed away on March 6, 1992.

Mrs. Arcuri was a legal secretary who was employed with Sal Eannace for many years, providing the law firm with loyal and conscientious service. As a caring and nurturing woman, she was lovingly dedicated to her children and grandchildren. In fact, it could be said of Virginia that "her family was her life."
